Janis Provisor and Brad Davis, the artist duo behind luxury carpet house Fort Street Studio, create material-driven masterpieces with an artisanal approach. "We used Dandong silk, a material like no other," says Provisor about their latest collection, Wild Silk. "It is soft and luxurious, yet also strong and durable. The cut pile is similar to suede, creating a powder-like aspect." In Blocks, the lustrous and weighty objects create a subtle fluidity; with Squeeze, saturated color gives way to elegant and variegated splotches and splatters. Geometry-induced lines and unexpected angles are combined with symmetrical softness in Flexform's Adagio sofa, created by architect Daniel Libeskind, whose numerous designs include the World Trade Center Master Plan and the Jewish Museum Berlin.
