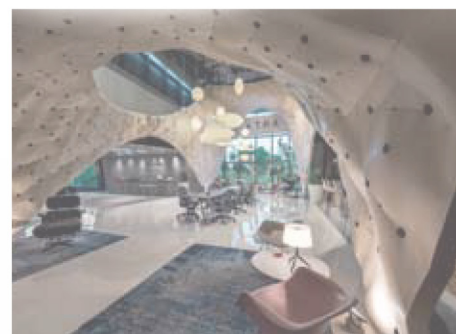
**WORLD MUSIC**
